Nancy and Paul Watten received notice that their daughter, Laura, head softball coach at the University of Maryland, was to be inducted into the Bethune Cookman first Athletic Hall of Fame in September of this year.

Laura coached at Bethune Cookman, a historically African-American university in Daytona Beach, FL for 9 years. She was the only white coach in the MEAC conference the entire time and her team won the conference championship 7 of her 9 years. She was also Coach of the Year those 7 years and in 2005 her team was within one game of the World Series.

When she took the job, conditions were such that she even had to build her own field at a local recreation center.

Laura is one of 12 (of 95 candidates) to be honored.
