Breast cancer prevention: How to reduce your risk

What can I do to reduce my risk of breast cancer?

Some risk factors, such as family history, can't be changed. But lifestyle changes have been shown in studies to decrease breast cancer risk even in high-risk women. The following are steps you can take to lower your risk: Limit alcohol,Don't smoke. Control your weight, Be physically active, Limit dose and duration of hormone therapy. Avoid exposure to radiation and environmental pollution

What else can I do?

Be vigilant about breast cancer detection. If you notice any changes in your breasts, such as a new lump or skin changes, consult your doctor. Also, ask your doctor when to begin mammograms and other screenings.

Have you ever wondered what happens to your trash once the city picks it up or how we can save water?

We will have 2 presenters at our October meeting: Carol Spruiell and Frances Meador.

Carol will show us that there is enough water in existing lakes to meet the DFW areas' future demands by employing low cost, how impact water supply options. Carol is employed by the Texas Conservation Alliance. She gives presentations to adult groups, including several retired teachers' groups.

Frances' presentation will briefly discuss landfills and why it is important for us to limit the amount of trash. Using the 3 R's-reduce, reuse and recyclewe can do that. Frances is employed by the city of Plano and gives presentations to adults and school children.

INTRODUCING DIAMOND PLUS!!!!!

Members of TRTA have been asking for a permanent membership card for years. Diamond Plus is the solution! It allows TRTA to be better stewards of membership dues by spending less on mailing renewals and paper cards and more on legislative activity! In order to get a permanent membership card you need to pay your state dues monthly (\$2.08 per month) instead of annually. You pay this \$2.08 monthly by a bank draft or out of your monthly annuity check (current monthly). There is a "\$5.00 off" voucher for first-time members for local membership dues. If you are interested in the new Diamond Plus please contact me or attend our meeting in October for more information. There is a form that you need to fill out and I will have those at our October meeting. Any and all TRTA members who wish to become Diamond Plus participants by converting to either current monthly or bank draft methods may do so upon their next renewals.
