## Take Care

Our District 10 Informative and Protective Services Committee interviewed Trooper Stephen Bynum from the Texas Department of Public Safety. Trooper Bynum travels across the state speaking to retired teacher groups, business and social clubs, conventions, and safety councils. The following was a very interesting piece of information I wanted to make sure you knew since it was somewhat NEW to me!

Can I cross a solid white line on the highway? According to the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (the bible for the DPS) the answer is yes. There are two sizes of a single white line. The four-inch wide white line, called a "fog line," is never prohibited. You are discouraged from doing it, but you can legally cross the line if you can do it safely. The eight-inch white line, called a "channeling line," is found mainly in cities and on Interstate Highways. You are not prohibited from crossing it, but you should not do it unless it is absolutely necessary and you can do it safely. The rule is the wider the white line the more prohibited your action.*

## YOU CANNOT CROSS A DOUBLE WHITE LINE, REGARDLESS OF THE WIDTH.

Legislative News<br>Pat Enlow, Member TRTA District 10 Legislative Committee

Bill Barnes, Legislative Consultant for TRTA, gave us some excellent insight into all matters legislative when he spoke at our September $19^{\text {th }} \mathrm{C}$-FB RSPA meeting. Here are some of his comments:

- There are 450,000 retired teachers in Texas and 1 million active employees. Add family and friends of retirees and actives and it gives us a huge voice! Use it or lose it! Call your legislators and tell them
your story. Research candidates and vote! (Politicians count on low voter turnout. Let them know you care what happens with TRS pension and health care!)
- Ask your legislators the following questions:
$\Rightarrow$ Will you support a cost-of-living-adjustment (COLA) $13^{\text {th }}$ pay check?
$\Rightarrow$ Will you support permanent funding as a base funded item for TRS-Care, so that we don't have to beg for money every two years? (We do pay premiums and deductibles for our health care!)
$\Rightarrow$ The money is there! As of December 31, 2017, there was $\$ 10.297$ billion in the "Rainy Day" Fund. Will you vote to use that money to support retirees? OR What is your proposal for finding the funds to support retirees?
$\Rightarrow$ Will you oppose any effort to change the TRS DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN for all current and future TRS retirees?
- $72 \%$ of retirees vote and only $35 \%$ of active teachers vote. Get active school personnel registered and to the polls.
- The average TRS pension check is $\$ 2000$ / month.
- TRS -Care is eating up more and more of that pension. According to Gov. Abbott, YOUR calls to his office and to legislators last legislative session forced a special session to address health care for TRS retirees. When you receive a "Call to Action" (usually put out by Tim Lee), follow the easy directions, and call or email your legislators! YOU make a difference.
- There is nothing wrong with our DEFINED BENEFIT PENSION PLAN. It is working as it should. You only have to collect your check each month. The reason legislators want a defined contribution plan is because you would have to manage your own money. There is $\$ 150$ billion to be made by legislators and financial managers to manage your money through a defined contribution plan.
- Bill Barnes and Tim Lee continue to work with U.S. TX Rep. Kevin Brady, $8^{\text {th }}$ Congressional District, to change the Windfall Elimination Provision formulas. For those of us who paid into Social Security for at least 40 quarters, this provision reduces our benefits.
